




We're bigger than we thought.


new Jewish households by 2035

Chatham, Durham and Orange counties' populations are projected to grow from 510k to 660k, adding 150k people to our area over the next 15+ years.






HOW WE GOT THE * NUMBERS

In 2018 our local synagogues reported 1,370 affiliated households with 3,650 people. According to a recent PEW study, 1/3 of us nationwide affiliate with a synagogue. So we multiplied our numbers by 3 to give us approximately 4,100 Jewish households, and nearly 11,000 people.
